Adult Learning Opportunities




Are thinking of working with children but not too sure where to start? Is it time to do something for yourself but can't commit to full time courses?


Are thinking of working with children but not too sure where to start? Is it time to do something for yourself but can't commit to full time courses?



The choice of units available allows you to tailor the qualification to your own interests and aspirations. The qualification is assessed by portfolio-based



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
